### **ELECTRICAL SAFETY**

As I travel around to work at events, I often see cases of potential danger – usually with temporary extension cables needed to feed some equipment or device. Very often I find that one of the people involved has been very kind and brought along an extension cable or two from home. Even worse is the DIY 'expert' who has made up a cable using the wrong size, type and-or length.

Another example is where cables have been connected end-to-end in order to reach the point of use.

The rules for using cables where there could be a danger to life are strict. This comes under the Health and Safety at Work Regulations. There is no space here to go into all the details but there are some golden rules. Never overload cables – the maximum possible loading is related to the cable size and length. Always use an RCD safety trip located near the point of use. Do not lay cables in areas which are likely to have foot traffic. Get your cables PAT tested.

If in doubt get a professional to give advice – or even to do the job for you.

## **CAR PARKING TICKETS – Parking Charge Notices**

Many of us have had the dreaded tickets for parking our cars on private car parks and/or on the frontage of shops or for on what appears to be a public road, but is not.

These tickets are NOT FINES and are issued by the company which operates the parking system.

They will normally be sent to the registered keeper of the car, based on information from the DVLA.

The tickets often refer to the assumed (civil) contract between the driver and the company, based on the terms published on their local signage and refer to only to a civil debt.

There is no legal obligation to pay and there may be legitimate reasons to avoid payment.

Inadquate signs or misleading, ambiguous information are examples. (Take photos!)

Non-payment can attract additional costs, threats and letters from debt collecting agencies.

Some people risk not paying, simply ignoring the ticket and subsequent letters and many get away with it.

It could be expensive for the organisation to take the matter to County Court where they might lose!

**Note: Penalty Charge Notices (PCN) from the local council are different, but you can appeal..**
