FIBRE BROADBAND UPDATE. Good news – the second fibre cabinet on Woodbastwick Road is fully up and running. I tried for ages to get the Fibre service with TalkTalk to no avail, even though I was an existing customer. All of the other providers said that they could provide it, so I went with Sky which offered a good deal! On a technical note, the initial speed was in the order of around 38Mbit/sec download, which is the maximum speed I could get (on my chosen tariff). As the system is adaptive (to the copper cable feeding the house), the speed dropped over about 2 weeks to a very usable 20Mbit/sec download and around 10Mbit/sec for uploads – which is just what I needed. It would have been pointless to pay for the fastest speed as the approx length 300metre copper cable to the house would have slowed it down to the same speed as I now have. Granville Hornsby
