In April you noted that Police Community Support Officers were being made redundant. PCSO Bob Hall has published reported crime each month. By far the most common and frequent intervention is with Domestic Abuse. Some years ago I inspected the Inter-Agency Child Protection arrangements of Essex County Council. In dealing with Domestic Abuse reports, the names of 27,000 children were passed in one year from the police to Essex Children's Services to assess as victims, witnesses, or present in the household.
